Tunbury school has identified the needs of those pupils receiving pupil premium funding and we have decided to use the following intervention strategies to help them make improved progress and to raise their standards of achievement in 2015/2016

- Providing small group work for pupils entitled to PP funding with an experienced teacher focussed on overcoming gaps in learning to help them make improved progress and to raise their standards of achievement
 - 1:1 support for pupils entitled to PP funding to help them make improved progress and to raise their standards of achievement
 - Additional teaching and learning opportunities for pupils entitled to PP funding provided through trained TAs or external agencies
 - Acquiring effective materials for pupils entitled to PP funding aimed at raising standards, particularly in reading and mathematics.
 - All our work through the pupil premium will be aimed at accelerating progress moving pupils entitled to PP funding to meet the end of year expectations (M4)

Initially this will be in English and Maths

- Pupil premium resources may also be used to target able pupils entitled to PP funding to achieve Mastery level.

To improve progress and raise the standard of achievement of Pupil Premium Pupils at Tunbury Primary School, the following Intervention/Programme/Support and Training will be implemented in 2015/2016:

- AEN trained Speech and Language Teaching Assistant to support the delivery of speech and language programmes in school for Pupil Premium children
- Funding school trips for those pupils unable to pay
- Subsidising school trips
- Funding of an additional Teaching Assistant to support Pupil Premium Pupils 1: 1 in class in Maths, Reading and Writing.
- Lego Therapy programme
- Teaching assistants trained in to carry out the Toe by Toe and Reading Recovery programme
- Social Use of Language programme
- Drawing and Talking

- Circle of friends
- Precision teaching
- Fine and gross motor skills programme for children requiring Occupational Therapy support
- Dysgraphia
- Play Therapy
- CHATTS counselling services
- Teaching assistants trained and the implementation of sensory circuits across Year R/KS1 and KS2
- Designated Trained Teaching Assistant to deliver Numicon support programme.
