Pupil Premium allocation

Tunbury Primary School has been allocated **£36,960** for the financial year **2016-2017** (April 1st 2016 to March 31st 2017)

Main barriers to educational achievement faced by eligible for Pupil Premium funding

At the time of funding we had 27 pupils eligible for Pupil Premium funding

At Tunbury Primary School we look at each individual child to ensure that we provide support that is needed to improve their achievement and progress. Every Pupil Premium pupil is allocated specific provision linked to areas of learning and identified gaps in English Maths. Pupils are also provided specific provision for Emotional, Social and Mental Health.

Pupil Premium funding is also used through our funding allocation for:

- School learning experiences, for example music lessons, school trips and extra-curricular opportunities.
- We also fund specialist areas of learning including Play Therapy and Speech and Language Therapy.
- Pupil Premium funding is also used to support Teaching Assistant deployment to classes.

How we measure impact of our expenditure and allocation

We monitor all pupils' academic attainment and progress each term using Teacher Assessments. Against our 9 point Assessment system and Pupil Progress Meetings. Using both assessment data, analysis and e and other support provided valuation, in addition to feedback from the Class Teacher, we assess the impact of additional provision and other support to make decisions about next steps to address barriers to learning.

Review of Pupil Premium Strategy

The school will review our Pupil Premium Strategy in **March** each year when funding allocations for the next financial year are known. This is an important milestone as key decisions need to be made about allocations of funding. We will also review our Pupil

Premium Strategy in **July** each year when we can evaluate and analyse the individual attainment and progress of each Pupil Premium child and decide on further academic programmes for the new academic year.

The school governors with responsibility for Pupil Premium and the Finance Committee will monitor spending and will monitor the impact of our provision on Pupil Premium Pupils as part of their reports that take place three times per school year.
